The Junior Commissioned Officer Student Training & Extern Program (JRCOSTEP) is offering internships to **EHS Undergraduate students (current Juniors and Seniors) and Graduate students.**

Internships include working with Alaskan EH professionals who focus on:

- Ensuring safety of village water supplies
- Prevention and control of diseases such as rabies, botulism and acute respiratory infections
- Working with small, isolated communities to develop internal environmental health capacity
- Conducting ground-breaking research for the benefit of Alaskan Natives.

Scope of internship:

- Assignments last 70-90 days between the months of May and August in local villages in Alaska
- Opportunity to attend and present at the state annual environmental health conference
- Duty stations in Alaska: Anchorage, Bethel, Dillingham, Fairbanks, Kotzebue, Nome, and Sitka
