Special regulations for daily and size limits apply to specific areas. No daily or size limits exist for any fish caught from privately-owned ponds and lakes.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible to hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation?

Chickasaw citizens are eligible to hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation in accordance with tribal laws. Anyone with a valid state-issued license is eligible to hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation in accordance with applicable laws.

What documents are required to hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation?

The Chickasaw Nation provides licenses to citizens at no cost for hunting and fishing. Visit Chickasaw.net/Hunting to apply for a license. Proof of Chickasaw citizenship, a form of ID and proof of hunter safety certification may be required.

How does a Chickasaw citizen hunt and/or fish on state-owned or managed properties?

The Chickasaw Nation Hunting and Fishing License grants the right to hunt and/or fish on state-owned and managed properties within the Chickasaw Nation; however, if the state-owned property requires a Wildlife Conservation Passport, it is the citizen's responsibility to purchase. To participate in special draw hunts on state-owned and managed properties, a state-issued license is required.

What is the annual bag limit for deer within the Chickasaw Nation?

Six: no more than two may be antlered. Deer taken during special draw hunts or during the holiday antlerless deer gun season do not count toward the combined season limit. Bag limits for the state of Oklahoma and the Chickasaw Nation cannot be combined. For information on season bag limits and other game animals, please visit Chickasaw.net/Hunting.



Where does a Chickasaw citizen get deer or turkey tags?

Pre-purchasing of tags is not required, although a report of harvest is required. Find more information on Chickasaw.net/Hunting. Upon submission, a unique confirmation number will be provided. This number will stay with the carcass to its final destination.

Where does a Chickasaw citizen get a duck stamp?

Duck stamps are federally regulated and federal guidelines will still apply. Duck stamps can be purchased at any U.S. post office.
