


Concurrence with and Support of the Application and Implementation of the FY 2009 Tribal Juvenile Accountability Discretionary Grant Program and the Continuation of a Juvenile Justice Tribal Advisory Board to Address Juvenile Crime and Delinquency


- WHEREAS,** in accordance with Article VII, Sections 4 and 7 of the Constitution of the Chickasaw Nation, the Chickasaw Tribal Legislature shall enact rules and regulations pertaining to the Chickasaw Nation, and shall make decisions pertaining to the acquisition, leasing, disposition and management of real property, subject to federal law, and
- WHEREAS,** in accordance with Article XI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Chickasaw Nation, the Governor shall perform all duties appertaining to the Office of Chief Executive. He shall sign official papers on behalf of the Nation, and
- WHEREAS,** in accordance with Article XI, Section 2 of the Constitution of the Chickasaw Nation, the Governor shall have power to establish and appoint committees, members and delegates to represent the Chickasaw Nation, by and with the advice and consent of the Tribal Legislature;
- WHEREAS,** the Chickasaw Nation has prepared and will submit a three (3) year grant in the amount of \$300,000 for the FY 2009 Tribal Youth Program's Juvenile Accountability Discretionary Grant Program funded by the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, U.S. Department of Justice, and
- WHEREAS,** a Juvenile Justice Tribal Advisory Board must be established and approved before the Chickasaw Nation receives the grant award from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, U.S. Department of Justice, pursuant to the grant requirements of the FY 2009 Tribal Juvenile Accountability and Discretionary Grant Program, and
- WHEREAS,** an existing Juvenile Justice Tribal Advisory Board has been maintained since 2005 and whose membership includes or will include representatives from the fields of law enforcement, prosecution, probation services, non-profit agencies involved with youth, social services, behavioral and mental health services, Indian child welfare, education and the juvenile court, and
- WHEREAS,** the existing makeup of the Juvenile Justice Tribal Advisory Board is fully supported by the Tribal Legislature and it is in the best interests of the Nation to continue the efforts of the existing Juvenile Justice Tribal Advisory Board that will continue to meet on a regular basis for the purpose of developing a coordinated enforcement plan for reducing juvenile crime.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chickasaw Tribal Legislature hereby supports the existing makeup and mission of the Juvenile Justice Tribal Advisory Board and concurs with and supports the application and implementation of the FY 2009 Tribal Juvenile Accountability and Discretionary Grant Program awarded by the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice.

Executed in regular session of the Chickasaw Tribal Legislature, meeting in Ada, Oklahoma, on February 20, 2009, by a vote of 12 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.
