CHICKASAW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE
General Resolution Number 26-068
American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Funding
for the Indian Reservation Roads Program

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article VII, Sections 4 and 7 of the Constitution of the Chickasaw Nation, the Chickasaw Tribal Legislature shall enact rules and regulations pertaining to the Chickasaw Nation, and shall make decisions pertaining to the acquisition, leasing, disposition and management of real property, subject to federal law, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article XI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Chickasaw Nation, the Governor shall perform all duties appertaining to the Office of Chief Executive. He shall sign official papers on behalf of the Nation, and


WHEREAS, the United States has made funding available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), Public Law 111-5, to create jobs and invest in American infrastructure development, and

WHEREAS, funding from the ARRA has been allocated to the Indian Reservation Roads (IRR) program for the purpose of completing infrastructure projects, and


WHEREAS, the Chickasaw Nation is eligible to contract with the United States to receive such ARRA – IRR funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chickasaw Nation desires to enter into a contract with the United States for ARRA – IRR program funding.



The law indicates that federal funding will be made available to create jobs and reinvest in American infrastructure. Tribes are eligible to contract for funding for Indian Reservation Roads projects.
