THE THE CEMETALY CEMETALY

The Mosely Family Cemetery is located about two miles northeast of Bromide, Oklahoma, in southwestern Coal County (figure 1). Information about this abandoned Chickasaw cemetery was gathered from an application submitted by an employee/citizen on June 8, 2018. The cemetery is located in a wooded area (figure 2) and needed heavy brush removal, fence repair and headstone cleaning and repair. Governor Palmer Simeon Mosely, wife Amanda Edith Greenwood and family members are buried in this cemetery.



THE TRANSFORMATION

These before and after photographs showcase the difficult task of uncovering and transforming an abandoned cemetery by the program's cemetery preservation specialists. The colored dots in the photographs mark the same location in each pair of before/after photographs.


