



SCHOOL

Participants have a structured education experience, managing classes, work and study time.

WORK

Participants are assigned on-the-job training sites located within the Chickasaw Nation treaty territory related to their field of study. These training sites provide supervisor instruction and invaluable work experience, so students are better prepared to enter the workforce after graduation.

COMPENSATION

Participants will receive up to a 40 hour stipend for school and work per week.

ELIGIBILITY

The School-to-Work Program supports nontraditional Chickasaw students who meet the following requirements:

MEET AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Age 25 or older at the time of application
- First-generation college student
- Single parent or guardian with custody of one or more children under 18
- U.S. Military veteran status

MEET ALL THE FOLLOWING:

- Chickasaw citizen
- 18 years old or older
- Possess a high school diploma or equivalent or a college transcript
- Valid driver's license
- Reliable transportation
- Be in good academic standing
- Enrolled (or accepted) into an accredited college or career technology center within the school-to-work service area as a full-time student

- Receive 80 hours of paid time off annually
- Career advising focused on the participant and their career
- Focused education planning
- Professional development
- Mentoring
- Establishing personalized goals for a successful transition from school into the workforce

- Career advocacy experts will help with portfolios, interview preparation and job search after graduation

The Chickasaw Nation School-to-Work Program serves Chickasaw citizens furthering their education.

Program participants can receive compensation while enrolled in a full-time college or vocational program and on-the-job training in specified degree fields. The school-to-work program supports personal and professional growth within its program participants while building a diverse Chickasaw Nation workforce.
